



Ball check valves:

- 1. Have been in use for centuries in liquid/slurry applications with proven history of reliability and longevity.
- 2. Have self-cleaning action for rags and other materials which would normally block other types of valves.
- 3. Have been used by V-RAM in municipal sludge cake pumps over 30,000 hours with no design or wear failures.

- 4. The effective wear surface of the valve ball is 50 times that of poppet valves. The urethane wear life is ideal for this application.
- 5. Ball valve components are readily accessible through hinged sections of the pump head and can be replaced within 2-3 minutes after the pump is opened.







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
